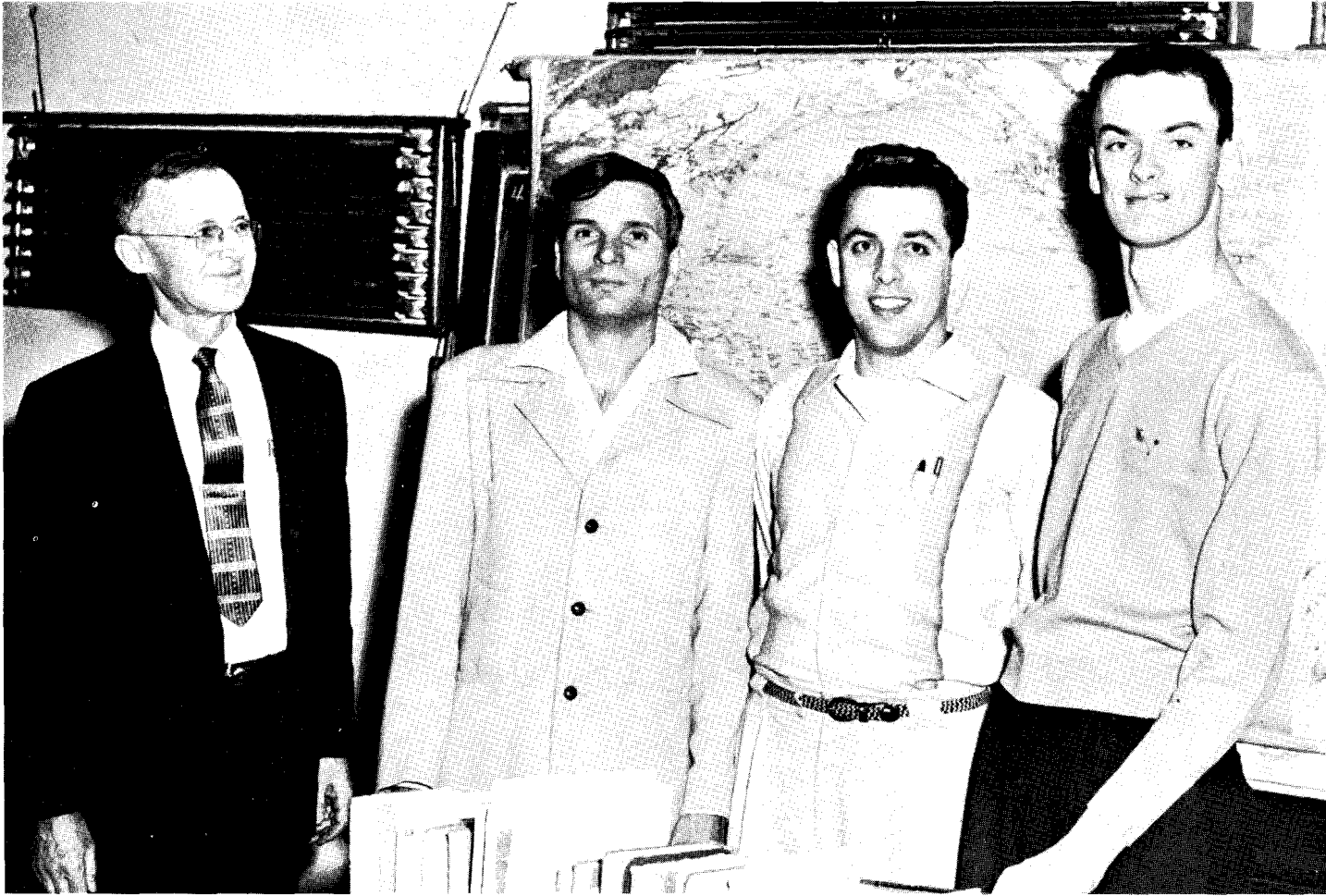

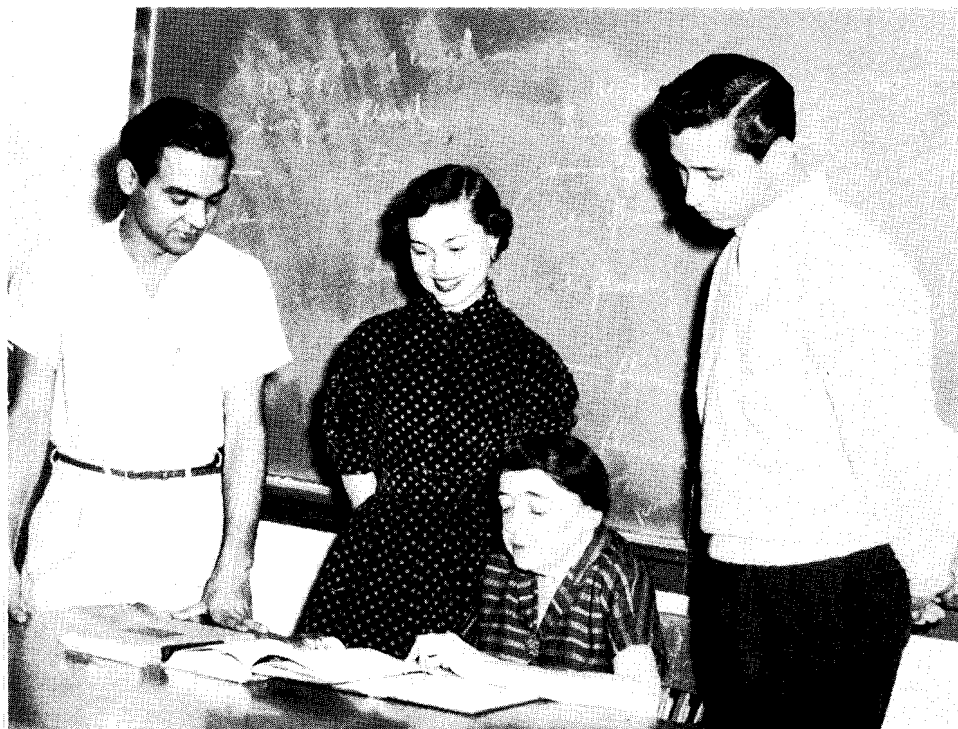

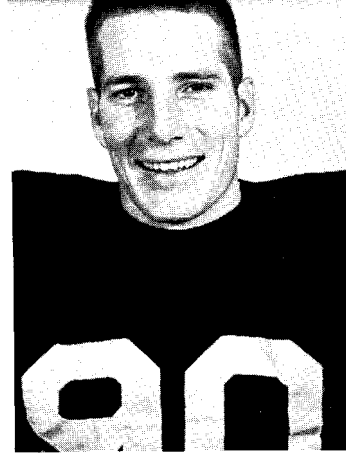

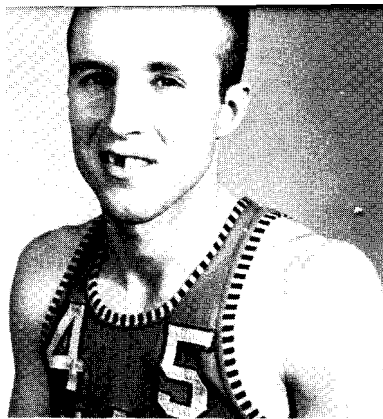


OKLAHOMA COLLEGIATE CHAMPIONS...
