
The focus of learning at Southeastern centers around the classroom. Here the instructor meets the student and horizons are widened as knowledge is absorbed.

Pep rallies, led by the cheerleaders, are frequent, and loyal Savage fans are always ready to cheer the team on to victory.


If it is not a pep rally it is a friendship fire, an election, or some other activity.


The many activities make the SSC student often sigh and wish "there were 48 hours in a day."















SSC boasts varsity teams in basket-ball, football, baseball, termis, and track and has compiled a fine record in the field of sports.

Disc Jockey club sponsors a campus dance every Monday night which serves as an enjoyable way to release excess energy and meet new friends.


Members of Boule service organization spend much of their time promoting good will projects for the college.

Participation in Intramural sport activities, by young men and women help balance the weight of their academic schedule.


The library seems to be the most active building on campus and each student makes use of its facilities.

The 1966 Southeastern grid team compiled a much improved season record from their previous campaign.

Despite the lack of seniors, usually a prerequisite for a winner in any conference, the Savages combined a balanced offensive attack with a stubborn defense in establishing their five win and five loss season record.

Southeastern's head mentor, Bob Thomas, said, "Ou main point of emphasis for the season was team effort. Our best example of this came out in our 20-19 come from behind victory over Langston University."
