Mascot Once Called 'Bell Hops'

Southeastern observed the 80th anniversary of its founding during the 1989-90 school year.

During the celebration, many school traditions were researched for their origin, one of which was The Savage, Southeastern's school mascot.

The school newspaper of the 1921-22 term reflected "athletics in Southeastern State Teachers Colleges undergoing a decided change.

When the normal school was made into a college, it was decided to upgrade the athletic situation to the collegiate level.

Requa W. Bell of McAlester was hired as athletic director. He scheduled several top Oklahoma oppo-

nents "for the purpose of placing our men in the athletic limelight of the state so that they may be rewarded for their work on the field and track by winning a berth on the All State teams."

A further boost to school spirit was the presence of the first Southeastern cheerleading squad. Organized by Willoughby Johnson, the all-male yell leaders became known as the "Bell Hops."

Taking their name from STC's new coach, the spirit squad wore blue and white uniforms and small round caps designed to make them appear as hotel bell hops.

Besides their sideline antics, the Bell Hops were primarily responsible for changing the nickname of STC teams from the Teachers to the "Savages."

Deciding that a team from deep in old Indian Territory should reflect the great Indian heritage of the region of southeastern Oklahoma, the name "Savages" was selected.

Rather than an insult to the Indians of Southeastern Oklahoma, the student body of 1921 meant for the nickname to be a great compliment.

The term "Savage" signified to them a fierce and proud fighter, not an uncivilized, beastly person.

The entire student body, many of whom were Indian, agreed with the feelings of the Bell Hops.

The 1922 *Holisso* yearbook dramatically reflected this fact. The book contained four insert pages

with original paintings by M.R. Marx.

Three of the paints depicted Indian scenes. The fourth, a page introducing the athletic section of the book, depicted STC trackmen starting a race with an Indian warrior-like spirit.

The picture which introduced the various classes showed an Indian village at sunrise. Another featured a beautiful Indian maiden and introduced the campus organizations.

Anyone reading the yearbook could not mistake the effort by the students to link the institution's history and campus life with its Indian heritage.















A new addition to the activities was the Magnolia Ball, an early day highlight of the school year.



Oklahoma Shakespearean Festival



Oklahoma Shakespearean Festival marked its first decade during the summer of 1989.

The organization, brainchild of Theatre at Southeastern director Molly Risso, has been based on campus during its first ten years.

OSF features several Shakespearean programs, a modern theatrical production, a musical, teen training theatre and the children's theatre.

The 1989 season offered *The Wizard of Oz*, *A Company of Wayward Saints*, *1776*, *Henry IV - Part 1*, *Romeo and Juliet* and *The Taming of the Shrew*.

The Wizard of Oz was a classic for young people of all ages. Over 75 local children sang and danced through the hour-long program.

A Company of Wayward Saints was the professional training program's production. The actors who played out their story used a blend of commedia and contemporary styles.

1776, a popular musical, took the audience back to the First Continental Congress and its struggles to forge the Declaration of Independence. The music brought the audience to an awareness of America's beginnings.

Decade of Excellence in Theatre



Henry IC, Part 1, featured political intrigue, rebellion, war, heroes and anti-heroes, comedy and bawdry, all wrapped up on one of the Bard's most exciting and colorful plays.

The ever-popular story of young star-crossed lovers, *Romeo and Juliet*, was moved to a setting of feuding families in Appalachia. Instead of sword play, the audience was treated to Bowie knives, barrels and jugs of "cider."

Again, the crew of the Oklahoma Shakespearean Festival reset a work of the playwright, this time moving *The Taming of the Shrew* to the 1940s. The lively comedy featured a radio show and the fun of the battle of the sexes. The show was also the dinner theatre.









The objectives of the fraternity were to promote wholesome school spirit comprising loyalty, cooperation and unity among the student body.





















A new mechanic, carrying forth a tradition of quality, destined from birth.


How many times more can I sit by my window, smile at days' end with a nice kind of sorrow?


