

Although their record was anything but impressive, lack of experience was their main drawback.


The team showed much potential strength and gave some good teams a scare during the season.

Their worst beating all season came at the hands of Northwestern 42-13, and several better teams couldn't do as well.


The conference champions, Langston, rang up an impressive victory 39-7, but runner-up Central was lucky to get off with a 26-13 win.

The students of SSC expect the freshman standouts of this year to carry the Savages to a better than average season in 1960.





