### FOREIGN LANGUAGE INSTITUTE

Increasing demand for foreign language study had its answer in Durant this year when the Foreign Language Institute was established by Southeastern and Oklahoma Presbyterian College.

Finding in the new program the potential of significant service and opportunity, the Durant Chamber of Commerce gave the institute enthusiastic support and financial backing.

The most modern language-teaching equipment available is provided in the new laboratory at OPC. Dr. Wade Baskin, head of foreign language study at Southeastern, directs the institute, where Russian, German, Spanish, and French are taught.

A marked increase in foreign language study was the immediate result of the new institute. In addition to regular students, special students of Durant and the area are taking advantage of the new program. Night classes in conversational Spanish and Russian have been organized with the specific purpose of serving special students.


. . . annual event at SSC and one of the most admired of its traditions. Each organization nominates its friend-liest boy and girl to carry a symbolic emblem to the fire.

Signal fires at four corners start the torches that are carried to the main bonfire. symbolic of the torches of friendship from the four corners of the world.


